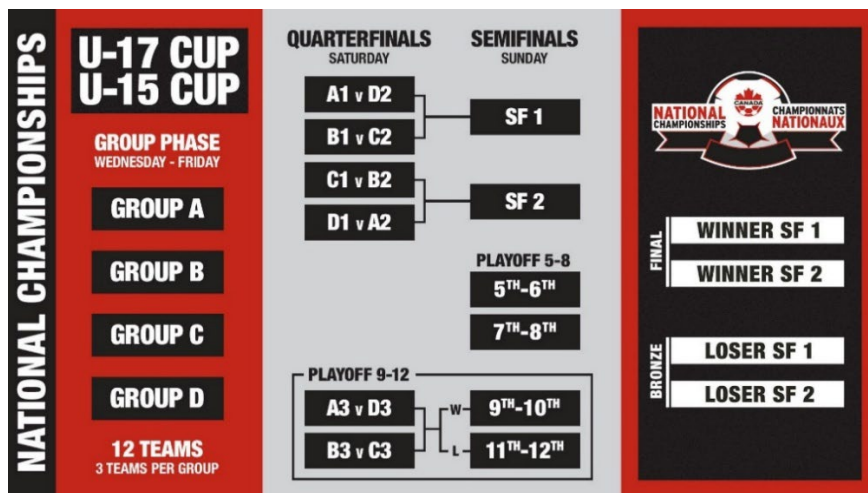

Canada Soccer's National Championships serves as a pinnacle event to the 2026 season, bringing together competitive clubs from across the country. This year's U-17 Cup will be played in St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador from 6 to 12 October with 12 teams in the boys' division and 12 teams in the girls' division.

Canada Soccer will deliver all key information pertaining to its national amateur competitions via www.canadasoccer.com/competitions.

The 24 participating teams for the 2026 National Championships U-17 Cup qualify through their respective provincial leagues up until 12 September. In total, 143 boys' teams and 104 girls' teams competed in their provincial competitions to reach this stage. As part of the Youth Competitions Network, teams have taken part in 2025-26 competitions leading to Canada Soccer's PDP Championship and youth National Championships.

COMPETITION FIELDS & FACILITIES

The 2026 National Championships U-17 Cup will be played at King George V Park in St. John's, Mount Pearl Soccer Complex in Mount Pearl, and Topsail Field in Conception Bay South.

King George Soccer Complex

In all, 52 matches will be played across the boys' and girls' divisions at the National Championships U-17 Cup, with the Final Matches played in succession on Thanksgiving Monday 12 October at King George V Park.

Training sessions

Training sessions, booked through the Local Organising Committee, will be organised at the three competition fields. All venues are open from 09.00 to 23.00 local time. Please note the competition does not have exclusive use of the fields — local teams will also play their scheduled matches, with the National Championships taking priority.

Dressing Rooms

Four permanent team dressing rooms at each of the three competition venues, plus one permanent referee room per venue with a second room made available as required. Rooms are assigned on arrival by field staff, who hold the keys and will lock and unlock rooms as teams need them. Teams have use of a dressing room pre-match. Dedicated toilet facilities are attached to the dressing rooms at all three venues; the Mount Pearl Soccer Complex has one main washroom with three dedicated bathrooms and a separate shower facility.

Athletic Therapy / First Aid

Each facility has a first-aid station, and physiotherapy and athletic therapy services will be positioned along the sideline on the team bench side. The therapists are working professionals based in and around the St. John's area. AEDs are in the canteen at King George V Park and in the office at the Mount Pearl and Topsail facilities, each with direct access from the field of play.

Ambulance services will be notified of the competition. The Local Organising Committee is working to have a doctor on site at each venue; this will be announced soon.

Technical / Spectator Areas

Only accredited staff and players are permitted in the technical area. Competition fields are gated and enclosed; venue staff hold keys so that gates can be opened for emergency personnel at any time during matches.

It is important that Participating Clubs, their players and team staff respect the fields and facilities accordingly. Clubs are expected to keep their benches clean and tidy after each match or training session.

MEDICAL FACILITIES & PHARMACIES

First-Aid services will be provided for all matches. Athletic therapy can be provided one hour prior to each match, although clubs must bring their own supplies for taping.

A doping control station is available in the main building at each venue. Emergency vehicles reach each field of play through a main gate; venue staff hold keys and will open gates for emergency personnel during all matches. The LOC Medical Officer's contact details will be announced soon.

AIRPORT ARRIVALS

Teams will be met at the airport by a member of the Local Organising Committee, who will be clearly identified, and escorted to the bus pick-up area outside the main arrival's doors. Teams travel by school bus, with luggage and team equipment carried on the same bus. Teams may be paired with another team arriving at a similar time

The Local Organising Committee will provide arrival and departure support at St. John's International Airport (YYT), 100 World Parkway, St. John's, NL A1A 5T2 — +1 709.758.8500.

The airport is approximately 6.6 km from King George V Park, 17 km from the Mount Pearl Soccer Complex and 26.8 km from Topsail Field.

TRANSPORTATION ON MATCH DAYS

All teams will be picked up from their hotel to ensure arrival at the competition fields at least 60 minutes prior to kick-off (officially 50 minutes before kick-off, or 10 minutes before your scheduled warm-up). Travel time from the team hotel is approximately 5 minutes to King George V Park, with longer transfers to the Mount Pearl Soccer Complex and Topsail Field (detailed plans will be shared before the group phase).

Depending on your venue, the bus will LEAVE the hotel between 60-90 minutes before your team's start time. Teams should be at the designated location 10 minutes prior to their departure. Teams that have played each other will not be scheduled onto the same bus. Return transport typically departs within 45 minutes of the final whistle.

Buses will be identified so that each team gets on the correct bus (look for a "team card" positioned near the front window of the bus). It is critical that teams board the correct team bus (please DO NOT board another team's bus for any reason). After your match and cool down (or as per your pre-assigned departure time), please proceed to the pick-up area. As a kind reminder, your bus needs to maintain their schedule so that other teams are not left waiting.

TRANSPORTATION PLAN

City Wide will supply transportation using school buses. Transportation services are provided for the following:

To / from the airport

To / from one training session

To / from all matches

To / from ceremonies (if required)

To manage the overall event logistics, the cooperation of teams is critical. If you DO NOT require transportation, please email Bob Antle at bobantle@nl.rogers.com by September 30, 2026

Teams approved to travel to the competition by ground must confirm whether they require local transport no later than two weeks before the competition. Teams may be charged for transportation costs arising from cancelled or delayed plans made without prior notice.

Pick up / drop off locations will be at the main entrance of the team hotel. At each venue, buses drop teams at the facility, from where it is a short walk to the dressing rooms. Team equipment travels on the bus with the team. Teams are expected to be at the pick-up location 10 minutes prior to departure. Buses cannot wait for teams or players and will be instructed to leave at their scheduled time.

Teams and staff are not permitted to use other buses to attend additional matches. If you would like to watch matches, you will need to coordinate your own transportation. On the final day of competition, luggage can be held at the team hotel.

TRANSPORT COMMUNICATION PROTOCOL

All transportation has been coordinated between the Local Organising Committee and City Wide.

A detailed transportation schedule, including pick-up and departure times, will be provided in early October, and a team-specific schedule will be distributed at the Pre-Competition Meeting. The Local Organising Committee will also provide an update each evening for the following day (starting 7 October).

TRANSPORTATION FOR TRAINING

Teams that attend optional training sessions will be dropped off five minutes before their scheduled training time and picked up immediately following the session.

COMPETITION MEETINGS

To help prepare for the National Championship, Canada Soccer will lead virtual and in-person meetings. Before departure, a member of each qualified team must attend a virtual pre-arrival meeting (conducted via Zoom, with schedule shared through each respective PTSO). Upon arrival, at least one member of each qualified team must attend the Pre-Competition meeting along with the uniform & equipment check (starting at 19h15 local time).

Canada Soccer Pre-Competition Meeting on Tuesday 6 October 2026

The Canada Soccer Organising Committee will chair the Pre-Competition Meeting. The PTSO Representative along with a staff or coach from each club must attend the meeting. All clubs must bring one example of each of their player and goalkeeper shirts and socks to this meeting (which means all colour variations for both outfield players and goalkeepers).

Clubs that have players who need to wear a cast or brace must have that equipment checked by the Supervisor of Officials (clubs must RSVP with Canada Soccer if they are bringing additional equipment that needs to be approved by the Supervisor of Officials).

OPENING CEREMONY

The Local Organising Committee will host an Opening Ceremony for all teams at the Holiday Inn St. John's Conference Centre on Tuesday 6 October at 19.00 to mark the start of the competition. Four meeting rooms will be opened into one large room, with guests seated at the front and all players seated in the room; a public address system is arranged. Following the ceremony, a local band will play for approximately one hour. No hotel pick-up is required.

CANADA SOCCER AWARDS

Following the Final Matches on Thanksgiving Monday 12 October, Canada Soccer will hold one ceremony to present awards for both divisions. The awards include the Most Valuable Player award, referee medals, player medals, and the Winners' Trophy. Each winning team will also receive a winners' banner, presented to the coach after the trophy presentation and before the team photo.

Finals Day will open with the two bronze medal matches on two different pitches, followed by the two Final Matches back-to-back at King George V Park. The Awards Ceremony will begin approximately 10 minutes after the last match concludes. All Clubs must attend one of the Final matches; the Local Organising

Committee will confirm which Final your team is allocated to and will arrange transport accordingly.
